It's not natural for us to love the lost so much we will sacrifice our time, money and energy in taking the gospel to the whole world.

It's not natural. It's very difficult. But it is possible. I know it's possible because that what God says He expects of us. That's why He taught us that the greatest command is to love Him with all our heart, soul, strength and mind, and the second greatest command is to love our neighbors as ourselves (Mark 12.30-31). That's why it was necessary for Jesus to become flesh and go to the cross ... so that we could witness love in action. That's why God gave His powerful, active word (Hebrews 4.12) that can transform our minds to become like Him (Romans 12.2).

The Most Difficult Command

What do you think is the most difficult command God has given us? I'm sure you could think of many options. I'm guessing the rich young ruler in Matthew 19 thought selling all his property and giving it to the poor was the most difficult thing God expected. And that would be tough, wouldn't it? Others might think the command in Luke 9.23 to deny yourself, take up your cross, and follow Jesus might the most difficult thing to do. What about the command to make every effort to live at peace with all men (Hebrews 12.14)? All

To decide which command God has given is the most difficult of all may not be possible, or even necessary. But this guestion came to my mind when I read 1 Corinthians 16.14: "Let all that you do be done in love." Now, that's a tall order!
