What Are You Chasing?

"See that no one renders evil for evil to anyone, but always pursue what is good both for yourselves and for all" (1 Thessalonians 5:15).

In the text above, Paul's word pursue is the same as "persecute" elsewhere in the New Testament. It means to chase. Saul persecuted Christians by chasing them down to harm them. After becoming a Christian, the same man urged the Thessalonians to chase what was good for themselves and everyone else.

By contrast, he urged them not to seek payback for ill treatment. Too many are bent on revenge! Jesus taught His disciples to "love your enemies, bless those who curse you, do good to those hate you, and pray for those who spitefully use you and persecute you" (Matthew 5:44). Revenge appeals to the flesh, but God calls us to rise above it.

Paul exhorted Timothy to flee the love of money and all the pitfalls that go with it, and to "pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, patience, gentleness" (1 Timothy 6:9-11). A few years later Paul urged him similarly: "Flee also youthful lusts; but pursue righteousness, faith, love, peace with those who call on the Lord out of a pure heart" (2 Timothy 2:22).

Successfully chasing something takes energy; it takes time; it takes determination and perseverance. Is what you catch worth the effort? If you're chasing revenge, money, or fulfillment of the fleshly appetites, you might say "yes" at first, but in the long run you'll be disappointed. The pursuit of righteousness and good things, however, yields rich rewards both now and eternally.

We are saved by grace. I've heard it all of my life, and I have preached it over and over. There's nothing man can do to earn his salvation. It comes as a gift from God. "For by grace you have been saved through faith; and this is not your own doing, it is the gift of God." That's the gospel truth!

We gladly welcome you to our congrega-

tion, trusting that - if you are seeking

Christ you will find Him here, if sorrowing

you will receive comfort and strength here,

if troubled in spirit you will gain the bless-

ing of peace here, if discouraged you will

rejoice in encouragement and hope here,

if friendless you will find companionship

and Christian love here. That these and

other blessings may be yours is our prayer.

But much of what I am hearing today indicates that there is nothing for man to do, and nothing he can do, to affect his salvation. And my Bible doesn't teach that! Think about it. If that kind of grace saves, then God has the sole responsibility for man's salvation. I can blame God if I'm lost. Furthermore, if He saves you, and doesn't save me, then He has become a respecter of persons (Something which He is not) "And Peter opened his mouth and said: Truly I perceive that God shows no partiality, but in every nation any one who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him." [Acts 10:34-35]).

The scriptures tell us that "Noah found grace in the eyes of the Lord." Through His grace God warned Noah about the flood which was to destroy the world, and told Noah to build an ark. Grace showed him a way of escape. Noah believed God and was obedient to God's instructions. "Noah did this; he did all that God commanded him" (Genesis 6:22). As a result of obedient faith, God's grace saved Noah. Thus grace provided the blessing; it was accepted by faith; and obtained by the obedience of faith. "By faith Noah, being warned by God concerning events as yet unseen, took heed and constructed an ark for the saving of his household; by this he condemned the world and became an heir of the righteousness which comes by faith" (Hebrews 11:7).

A wonderful example of God's grace is found when "Philip went down to a city of Samaria, and proclaimed to them the Christ" (Acts 8:5). "But when they believed Philip as he preached good news about the kingdom of God and the name of Jesus Christ, they were baptized, both men and women" (Acts 8:12) Grace was extended through the gospel; faith accepted the message; and the people became obedient to the faith.

Opening Their Treasures

The story of Jesus' birth is a powerful and important story for all Christians. The birth of Jesus had such an impact on the entire world that, early in the fourth century (AD 336), the holiday we call Christmas was widely celebrated all over the East and West. The impact of the coming of the Christ was, as Paul said in Galatians 4:4, at just the right time. A time God had been promising to every generation of His people when the long-awaited Messiah would come and save us from ourselves. Starting with Genesis 3:15 all the way through to Malachi 4:2, God has promised that He is sending us a "Sun of Righteousness" who would come with healing in His wings. Make sure to take the time to read the story of Jesus, especially the story of His birth, this Christmas season.

One passage that has always stood out to me, as important and often overlooked in the Church of Christ, is Matthew 2:11. In this story, wise men from the east, arrive in Jerusalem seeking the newborn King of the Jews. After some direction from the chief priests and scribes, they make their way to Bethlehem. Miraculously, they saw a special star in the sky, followed it, and eventually arrived at the house where the child Jesus and His parents were staying. Going into the house and seeing the child, they fall down and worship Him. Then, in an act of great worship and devotion, they open up their treasures and give gifts to Jesus. Gold, frankincense, and myrrh were the most expensive gifts available at the time and they spared no expense for this new King.

Shouldn't we as believers and Christians follow their example and offer gifts to our

Lord and Savior Jesus Christ? There are five gifts that we should all consider giving to Jesus.

We should give Him our time by devoting time to serving Him, studying about Him, worshipping Him, and being His representatives in a world He died to save.

We should give Him our treasures by giving the first and best that we have. The treasures of our hearts, minds, lives, and money to Him every day we are blessed to have in this world.

We should give Him our talents by giving to Him those special passions, skills, and desires that are gifts from Him. Every person has special talents and skills that Jesus has blessed you with to use for the betterment of this world.

We should give Him our tongues by speaking about Him every day, praising Him in all that do and say, and assembling with His saints to worship and celebrate all the gifts He has given to us.

"Then, opening their treasures, they offered him gifts, gold and frankincense, and myrrh" (Matthew 2:11, ESV).
