Fanny Crosby

The grave of Fanny Crosby, in Bridgeport, Connecticut, has a Simple marker that reads, "Aunt Fanny - She Hath Done What She Could."

Fanny Crosby was blind from six weeks of age because of a mistreatment by a man claiming to be a doctor. Yet she wrote more than 9000 hymns such as: Blessed Assurance; All the Way My Saviour Leads Me; I Am Thine, O Lord; Jesus, Keep Me Near the Cross; Praise Him, Praise Him; Rescue the Perishing; To God Be the Glory" and Tell Me the Story of Jesus, to name a few.

Although blind, she was the guest of six presidents and a personal friend to Grover Cleveland. Her 9000 hymns were set to music by every popular American tunesmith of the nineteenth century and still blesses the church of Jesus Christ in our day.

The Presence of God

In the book of Exodus, we read about the "presence of God." God's people encountered His presence - -

at the burning bush (Ex. 3-4),

in the 10 plagues sent on the Egyptians (Ex. 7:-11),

crossing the Red Sea (Ex. 14),

in the cloud and pillar of fire (Ex. 13),

in the thunder, lightning, loud trumpet blast, smoke and fire at Mt.Sinai (Ex. 19),

in the angel sent ahead of them (Ex. 23),

in the ark of the Testimony-between the cherubim (Ex. 25:22),

in the glow of Moses' face (Ex. 34:29-35) and

as the completed tabernacle was filled with the Lord's glory (Ex. 40:34-38).

The presence of God was also felt in New Testament time. The prophet Isaiah used the name "Immanuel" to refer to the coming Son of God. That name means "God with us" (Mt. 1:23). The Hebrews writer referred to Jesus as "the radiance of God's glory and the exact representation of His being." (Heb. 1:3).

What about you and me? I'm glad that God's presence was revealed to the Israelites and that Jesus personally came to the earth. But I'm very glad that you and I aren't left all alone. God's Holy Spirit lives in each and every one of His children today. The indwelling of the Holy Spirit cannot be discerned by physical, mental or emotional manifestations. But just like we "know" that God forgives our sins when we are baptized, we "know" that His presence is with us today! We know because of the promise of God (Acts 2:38; 5:32; 1 Cor. 6:19, 20; Eph. 1:13, 14). Be thankful for His presence in your life!
